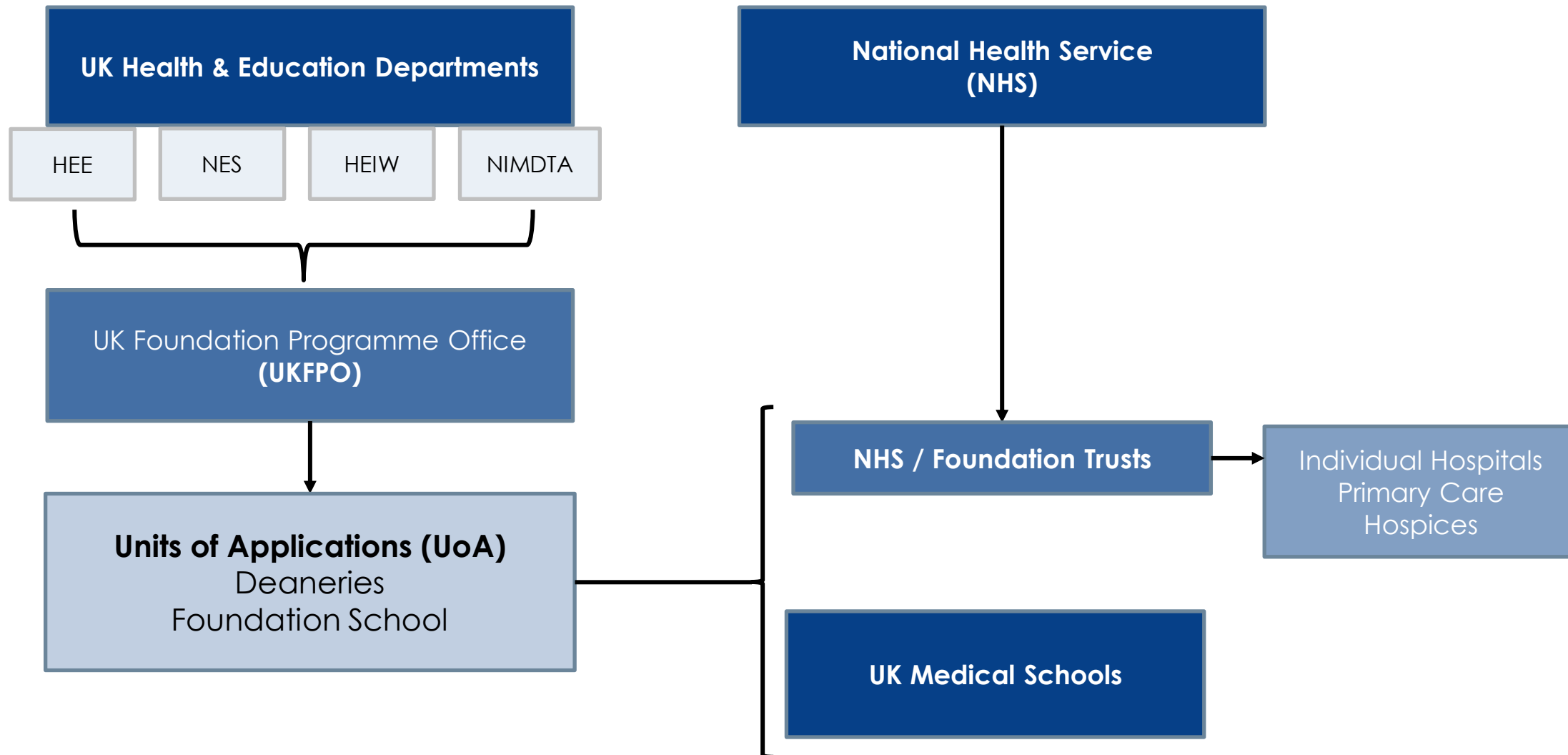

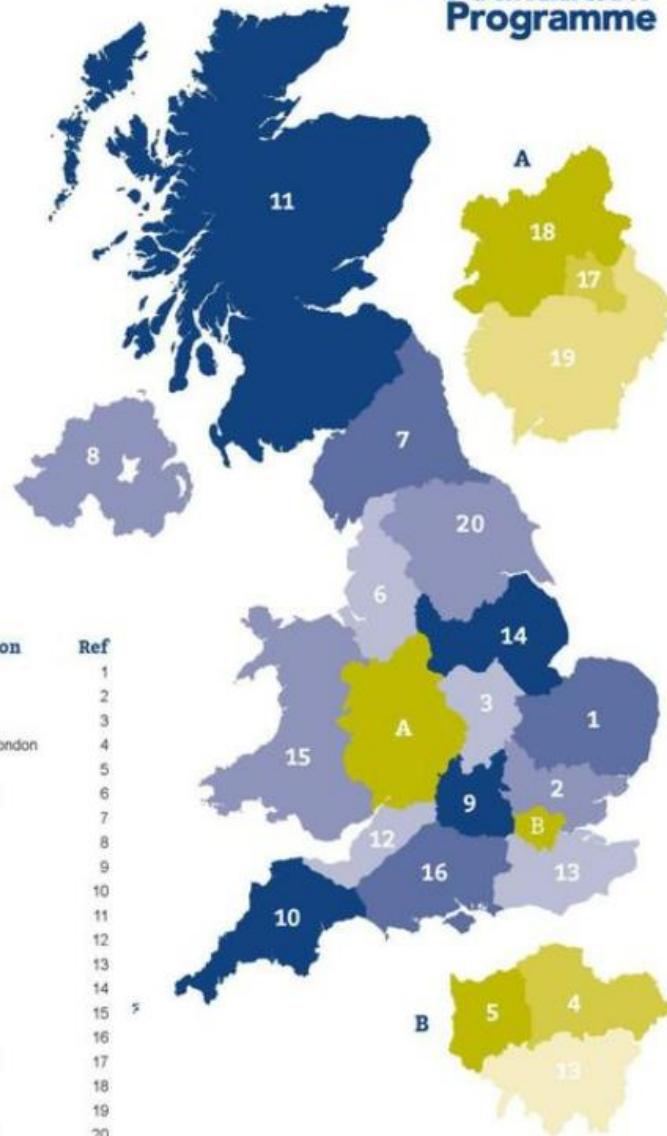


UKFP Organization Hierarchy

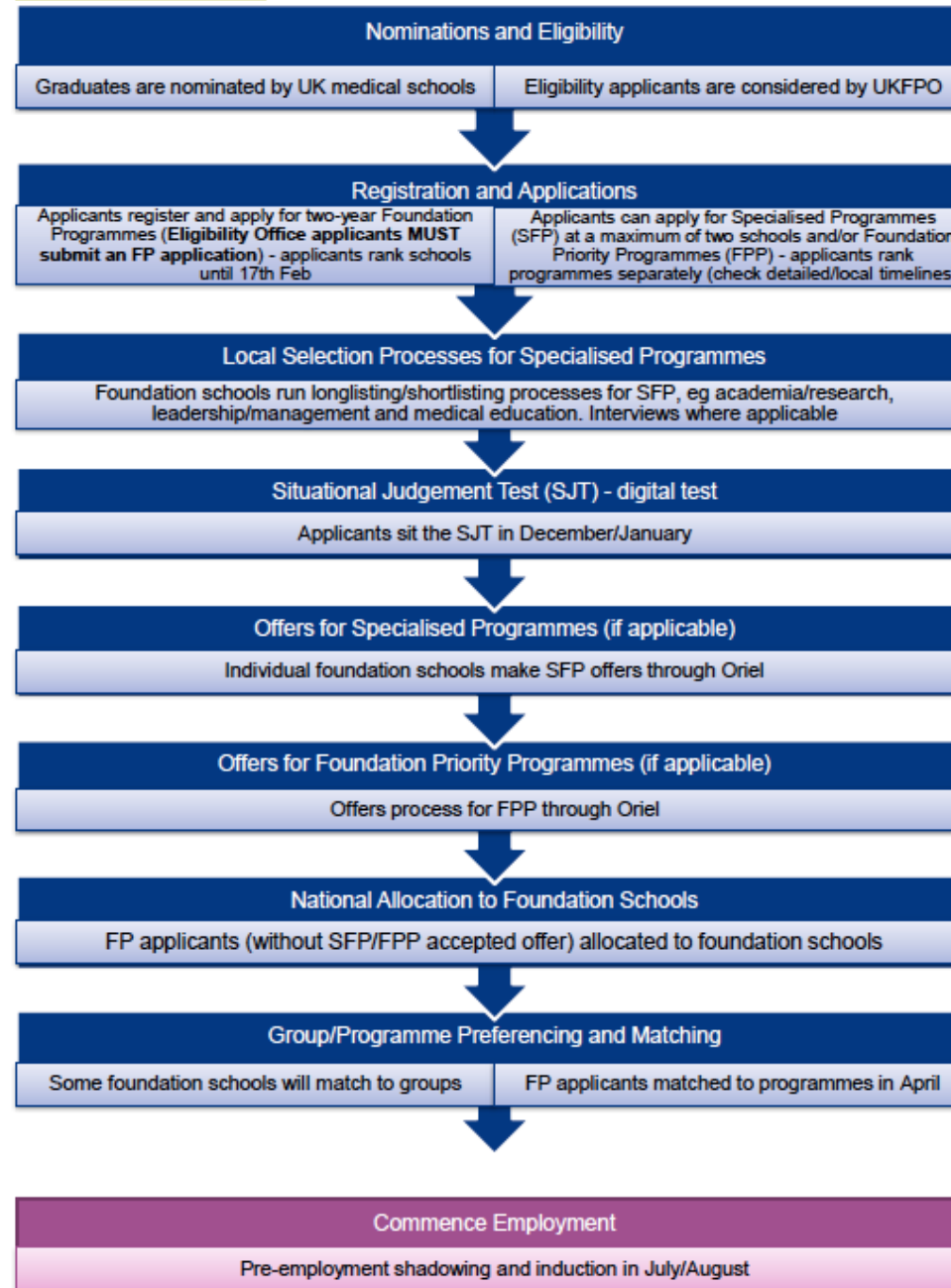

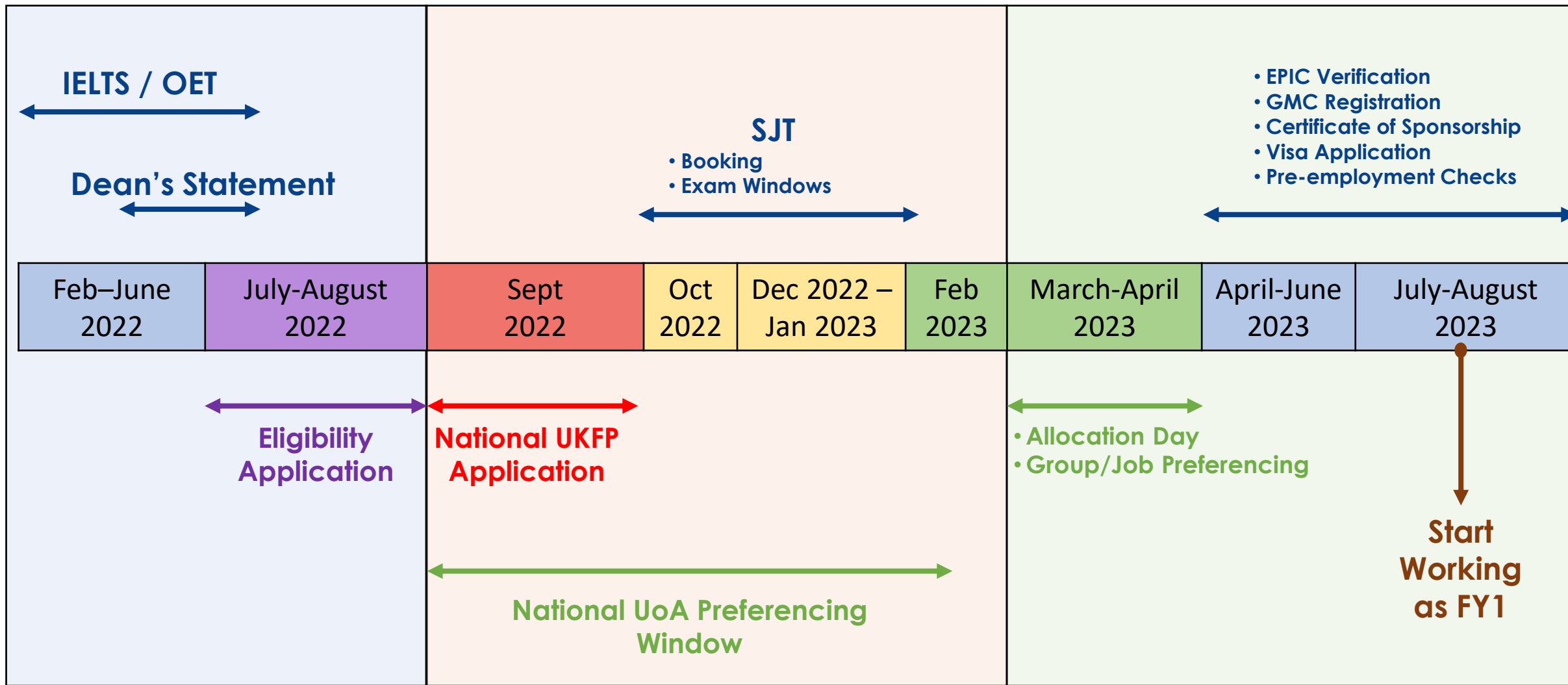
Process Map

1. Proof of ID: Passport, Driver's license, etc
2. Dean's Statement
3. Primary Medical Qualification
 - If you don't have it yet, submit dean's statement
4. English Language Proficiency: OET or IELTS
5. GMC Provisional Registration Eligibility
6. Right To Work

Decile Ranking

SECTION 3 – Decile Ranking

The applicant's decile ranking must be calculated in the following way:

1. Compile the overall academic results for all students within the applicant's year group. The year group does not need to have graduated yet to compile results for the purposes of decile ranking.
2. Divide the year group into ten equal groups based on their academic performance (that is, total number of students divided by 10).
3. Assign the applicant a decile ranking based on their position in the group. For example, if there are 150 students in the year then each decile is made up of 15 students ($150/10 = 15$ students). Students ranked 1 to 15 will be in the 1st decile, students ranked 16 to 30 will be in the 2nd decile and so on. Where necessary, please round decile boundaries to the higher whole number, for example 134 students mean a decile boundary of 13.4, so the 1st decile should be rounded up to include students ranked 1 to 14; the 2nd decile 2 boundary is 26.8 and should be rounded up to include students ranked 15 to 27 and so on.

Booking Window

≈ October (4-5 days)

Test Periods

1st Period ≈ December

2nd Period ≈ January

- Approx. month after National Application
 - Through PearsonVue (<https://home.pearsonvue.com/ukfp>)
 - Can change date of SJT later

- Preparation Period ≈ 2-4 weeks

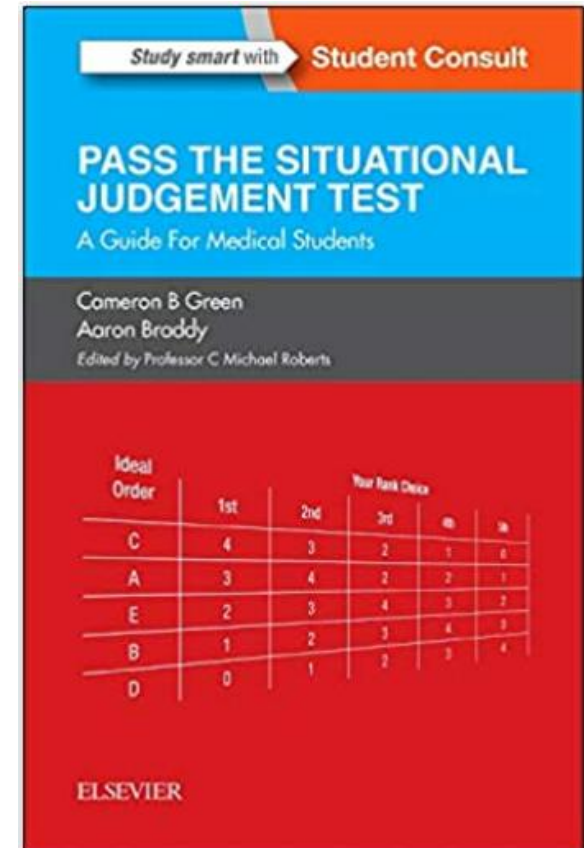

- Preferencing:
 - Ranking Units of Applications (UoAs) → (Group) → Programme (i.e. Jobs)

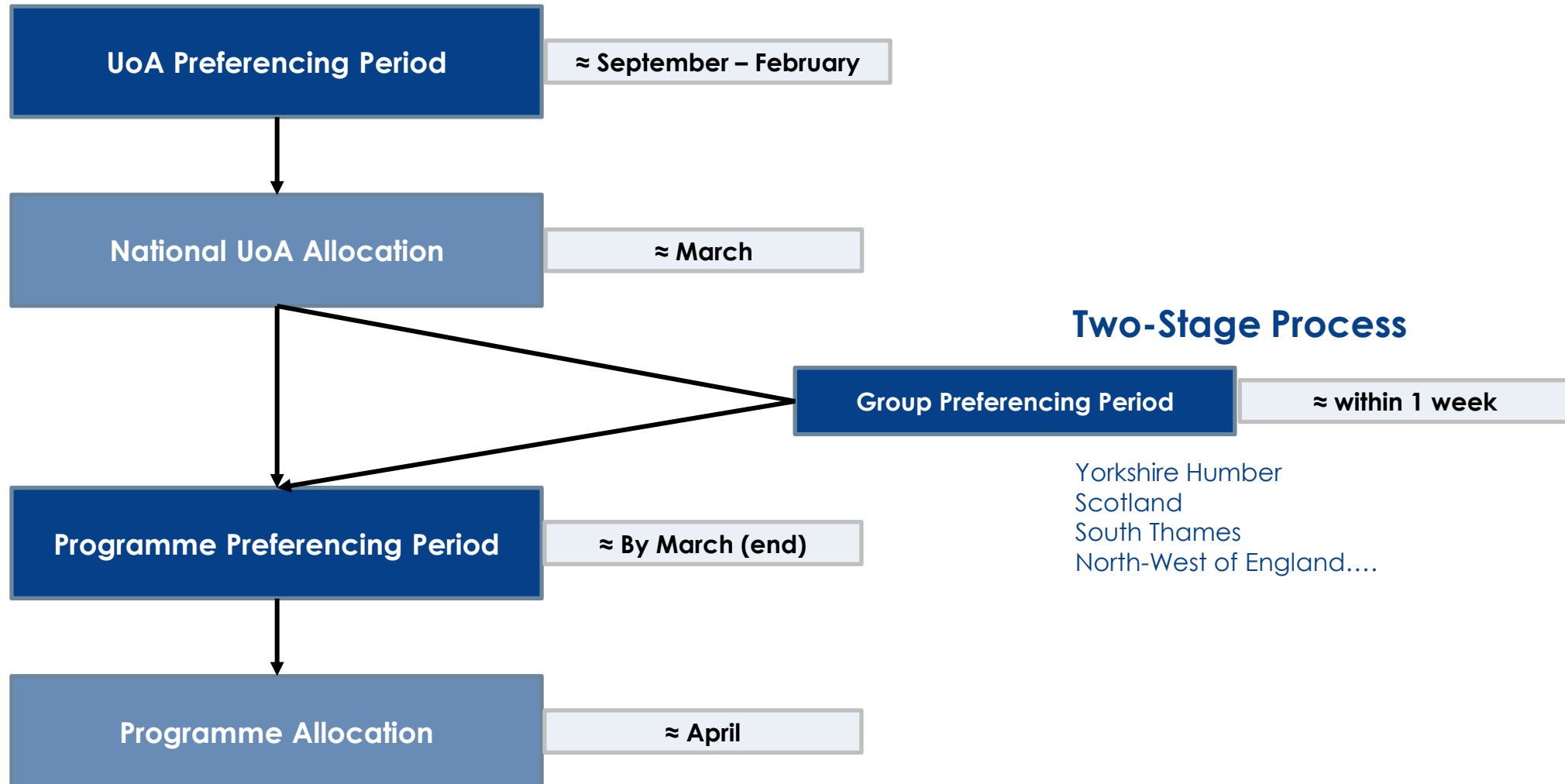

| For FP applicants | MUST rank all UoAs |
| For SFP applicants | ONLY select Two UoAs |
| For FPP applicants | Directly rank programmes |

- Allocation based on:
 - Higher Score = Higher Rank = Higher Likelihood of First-Choice Job

| For FP / FPP applicants | EPM + SJT = 100 points |
| For SFP applicants | Individual UoAs Criteria |
